City of Philadelphia & OSHA-30 Clarification (Plumbing)

- A) Having an OSHA-10 or OSHA-30 Certification is NOT a condition or requirement for an Apprentice Plumber, Journeyman Plumber or Master Plumber license renewal or new license.
- B) Having an OSHA-10 or OSHA-30 Certification is NOT a condition or a requirement to apply for, or to obtain a plumbing permit.
- C) Under normal circumstances, the General Contractor responsible for a construction project is required to have one or more supervisory employees that is OSHA-30 certified.
- D) All Plumbers, Helper, Apprentice, Journeyman or Master working in any capacity on a construction and or plumbing project of any type must be OSHA-10 certified. There are no exceptions. **Note**, this is not a condition or a requirement for obtaining or renewing a Plumbing License.
- E) OSHA-10 Certifications do not expire and are not required to be repeated nor do they require continuing education either by OSHA or the Department.
